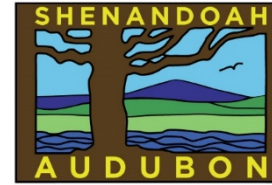

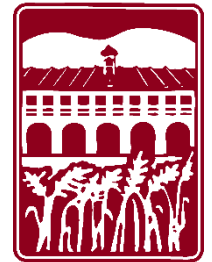

### Key to Abbreviations

- Sp** Spring (mid March through May)
- S** Summer (June to late August)
- F** Fall (late Aug. to early Nov.)
- W** Winter (early Nov. to mid March)

- C** Common – a species that is consistently present and usually encountered in appropriate habitat.
- U** Uncommon – a species that is often present but not encountered on every trip.
- O** Occasional - a species that is not reported every year
- R** Rare – a species that has occurred only a few times.
